Dear Middle School Parent(s) and Guardian(s),

It is hard to believe, but the summer is fast-approaching! With the summer months lurking, and while fun in the sun is on our minds, learning, especially the art and practice of reading, must not take a vacation.

Learning does not end each June; rather, by continuing to engage their minds, students will arrive back to school in September feeling accomplished and in a better position to begin their next academic year. Summer reading is critical to academic growth by helping students sustain their learning while school is out. Educators and parents agree summer reading matters. According to a Scholastic *Teacher & Principal School Report*, 96% of educators agree that providing year-round access to books at home is important to enhancing student achievement. Summer reading also assists students to avoid the dangerous "summer slump" or "summer slide" by keeping their minds awake and alert.

This year, St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic School is requiring two texts for our rising 6th, 7th, and 8th Grade students. Students will be asked to read and write critically about the novels. This is extremely important for the middle school team as a means of assessing the individual needs of every student upon their return to school in the fall. Specifically, the writing component will inform us where the "trouble spots" might be hiding, thus informing our English instruction in those first weeks of school. Additionally, having required reading allows for more structured discussions during those first few important weeks of school. In an exciting addition to the required text for each grade, we have coordinated "One Book, One Middle School" on the life and times of Bl. Carlo Acutis. Several months ago when I happened across this small biography, I was taken aback by the many connections our students could make to Acutis as he, like them, was a young teen with struggles and challenges among his peers. However, his faith was stalwart. Acutis's love for our Blessed Mother, the Rosary, the Holy Mass, and Confession makes his life particularly meaningful. Upon your student's return to St. Thomas, the middle school team will have broader character and faith discussions on the life and times of this recently soon-to-be saint of the Roman Catholic Church. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, just approved the third miracle needed for sainthood! Acutis will undoubtedly be a role model for all Christian youth for generations. Acutis's canonization date is pending, but the excitement is building already.

Ms. Tommaselli, my ELA colleague, will co-coordinate our middle school summer reading program. We both look forward to partnering with you and your students over the summer months and greeting them in middle school this fall. Please contact me if you have any questions or concerns. 



"Carlo Acutis, born May 3, 1991, fully embraced the gift of life. Known as a computer whiz, he also liked to play soccer, video games, and the saxophone. He enjoyed watching his favorite police dramas and making short films with his star cast of cats and dogs. He had many friends and enjoyed spending time with them. Yet Carlo was a little "different" at school, in the pizzerias, and on the soccer field. What set Carlo apart was his constant pursuit of holiness. In addition to his fun hobbies, he spent time teaching catechism classes and serving in soup kitchens. Carlo loved to attend daily Mass and frequent Eucharistic adoration. The Word of God and the Eucharist were the center of his life. Carlo's unwavering devotion to the Eucharist inspired him to tell the story of Eucharistic miracles through a website he created just for fun. He wanted to deepen his own knowledge of these phenomena, to strengthen his devotion to Jesus, and to invite others to grow in love for the Eucharist. The website subsequently caught the attention of people across the globe, introducing countless people to Eucharistic miracles. Carlo died from a sudden and violent illness in 2006 at the age of fifteen. In less than a decade, his story spread across Italy and around the world. After Pope Francis declared him venerable in 2018, his beatification was celebrated in Assisi on October 10, 2020. The next step will be canonization, making him the first millennial saint." -From Amazon Reads




